To build an innovative, light, ethical and self-sustainable EU support mechanism for evidenceinformed policy on biodiversity and ecosystem services



Health and biodiversity request

Scoping phase

Objectives

- Ensure European policy relevance
- Avoid replicating work that has been done already
- Assess the amount of work (literature, person/month...) and check if this matches EKLIPSE resources
- Choose the most appropriate methodology

Means

- The KNOCK Forum
- Contacting experts (Garside, Marselle, Bowler...)
- Literature scoping
- Dialogue with the requester



Health and biodiversity request

Refining the request formulation

Which **types** of urban and suburban blue and green spaces and which characteristics (**components**) of such spaces have a significant impact on human mental health and well-being?

(note: the requester has a specific interest in positive impact in order to design recommendations and policies)

Secondary questions:

- 1. Can we discriminate different components of nature or type of natural spaces that have a greater impact on mental health than others?
- 2. What are the correlations between the effects of nature on mental health?



Results of literature scoping

- Classic literature search >>> more than 150000 papers
 - would need refining the search equation, a test list and ... time
- Search focused on « reviews » >> 3179 articles
 - Sorting on title >> 155
 - Sorting on abstracts >> 57
 - Sorting by key eligibility criteria on full-text >>> 17 reviews retained

There are more than 17 as the test-list is not entirely found


- Comments have been taken into account (PNSE3, policy makers & you...)
